Readings:

When you are harvesting your crops and forget to bring in a bundle of grain from your field, don't go back to get it. Leave it for the foreigners, orphans, and widows. Then the **LORD** your God will bless you in all you do.

Ruth 2 selected verses **Ruth Works in Boaz's Field**

Ruth said to Naomi, "Let me go out into the harvest fields to pick up the stalks of grain left behind by anyone who is kind enough to let me do it." The foreman was asked if she could gather grain behind the harvesters. She was hard at work with just a few minutes' rest in the shelter." Boaz went over and said to Ruth, "Stay right here with us when you gather grain; don't go to any other fields. Stay right behind the young women working in my field. See which part of the field they are harvesting, and then follow them. I have warned the young men not to treat you roughly. And when you are thirsty, help yourself to the water they have drawn from the well."

¹⁰ Ruth fell at his feet and thanked him warmly. "What have I done to deserve such kindness?" she asked. "I am only a foreigner." ¹¹"Yes, I know," Boaz replied. "But I also know about everything you have done for your mother-in-law since the death of your husband. I have heard how you left your father and mother and your own land to live here among complete strangers. ¹² May the LORD, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge, reward you fully for what you have done."

¹⁵ When Ruth went back to work again, Boaz ordered his young men, "Let her gather grain right among the sheaves without stopping her. ¹⁶ And pull out some heads of barley from the bundles and drop them on purpose for her. Let her pick them up, and don't give her a hard time!" ¹⁷ So Ruth gathered barley there all day, and when she beat out the grain that evening, it filled an entire basket. ¹⁸ She carried it back into town and gave it to her mother-in-law, Naomi. Ruth also gave her the roasted grain that was left over from her meal. ¹⁹ May the LORD bless the one who helped you!"

Message: Harvest? A Climate in Crisis!

Here are some things for you to think about. We all have loads of equipment...

What is the Link? Where has the produce come from? Where is it going to?

In Matthew 22:37 - 40, Jesus tells us that God's greatest commandments are to love God and to love our neighbours.

In the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37), Jesus shows us we are called to be good neighbours to anyone who needs our help – whether they live next door or across the world.

We can help share the load of the climate crisis with our global neighbours this harvest. Your neighbour's harvest is empty. Deadly droughts, made worse by the climate crisis, means another season of hunger looms. But it doesn't have to be this way. The climate crisis is hitting people in poverty the hardest – the ones who have done the least to cause it. It is leading to more frequent and more severe disasters. Farmers have seen the land become barren and empty due to prolonged drought. The crops have died, families are hungry.

The climate crisis is a daily burden for many people. The time to act is now. The church cannot ignore this urgent crisis. As nations gather at the UN Assembly, climate change features again, perhaps the biggest stumbling block facing our world right now. From green energy to recycling PPE, we can all play our part; can we also be brave at holding our leaders and corporations to account for their part in making this world the best it can be for everyone? If greed is at the root of many of these issues, is that the kind of barrier Jesus meant lies between us and God?

The climate crisis has been brought home this week, with the risk to supplies reaching our supermarket shelves, limited gas supplies and energy prices soaring, Universal Credit payments being reduced
