**Reflection on prayer:**

Why does prayer cause so many of us problems?

I thought I knew how to pray. I had been taken to Church at two weeks old - and gone most weeks since.

I knew the Lord's Prayer, said Grace before meals and prayers at bedtime. Yet I still did not feel comfortable praying out loud. Somewhere along the way I had missed the lessons on "How to pray in front of others".

How did others always seem to find the right words, so deep and meaningful, making mine sound silly in comparison?

I could start with "Dear Father God" and end with "Amen", but the middle was just a jumble of random thoughts.

Then someone told me to think of it as a conversation with a friend! Well anyone who knows me knows I have no trouble with that. I can chat with friends all day long.

And that is when the light bulb moment happened, I also found the more I prayed the more comfortable I became. I realised that I didn't have to use fancy formal words.

God knew me and He knew how I expressed myself, He was my best friend. I could talk about my day, the things that had gone well and those that seemed a disaster.

I realised I was praying more often, not just when I needed help. I could pray in the traffic jam, in the queue for shopping, when I had done something good or of which I wasn't so proud of. When I needed help with a decision or in fact any part of my day just as I would with a friend.

I also learned to stop and give God a chance to reply. There is nothing worse than a friend who doesn't allow you to get a word in.

The Lord's Prayer is a great template to remind us of some of the things we need to discuss even if we do not use it word for word.

First we greet God and let him know how much we appreciate just who He is. We then pray for God's Kingdom here on earth and that we might be ready to hear and respond to His answers.

We can ask Him for what we need and also the needs of others.

The hard bit comes next, admitting to what we have done wrong and asking God for forgiveness. We can then ask Him to help us to stay on the right track and make us better at following His will.

Finally we close in praise and an acceptance of God's answers to our prayers.

Never forget to make it a two way conversation, for the more you pray and listen the more you will recognise God's responses.

**Message:                      Text: Thy Kingdom Come                      Matthew 6:10**

We are planning to take a serious part in the ‘Thy Kingdom Come’ campaign this year as part of our recovery. We have looked at prayer loads over my time in the circuit, maybe it was for such a time as this. Churches can be open for private prayer, so we plan to have prayer days around the churches.

Thy Kingdom Come is a prayer initiative between Ascension Day and Pentecost to empower the mission of the church. What is important is that God’s Kingdom does come in this world of need, into the communities we are called to serve and to hearts that are lost without knowing the love of God. We do not know how prayer works but we know it does.

We also know that it is one way God wants us to be involved. I love the words of the old hymn, **“Prayer is the soul’s sincere desire, uttered or unexpressed, the motion of a hidden fire that trembles in the breast”** and further on: **“Prayer is the Christian’s vital breath, the Christian’s native air.”**

Prayer is so vital that Jesus teaches a pattern in the Sermon on the Mount and we are going to look at that pattern in this message under four headings: **approach, requests, reflection, and praise.**

How do you approach God? What names or titles do you choose to use? There are so many to choose from. I think they often come out of the ways we experience God or how we have been taught to think of Him. I believe that is alright as long as we don’t judge others for the ways they approach Him. Example views of God from scripture: Eternal God, I Am Who I Am, The Lord is peace, faithful God, God of gods and Lord of lords, the Lord Almighty, Immanuel, the God of heaven, and so many more. Think about the way you address God and why you use those terms. Do they come out of the way God has related to you? Has He proven His faithfulness or brought you peace in difficult circumstances? Have you had your eyes open to His Lordship or to His consistent presence, Immanuel?

Jenny was a student at Cliff College and a co-leader with me on a couple of church missions. She told me that she thought our Principal, Dr Davies, was the best example of God that she had found in any human being. He was a powerful, wise, authoritative leader with a sense of fun. I thought she was very perceptive and right.

In Matthew 6 Jesus calls Him ‘Our Father in heaven’. I realise that this name may cause issues for people because the image relates to a human relationship that may not have been good. It is though the name Jesus uses and encourages His followers to use. Not because He wants to cause upset or pain but because it relates to the intimacy that God desires us to have with Him and He with us. It is the how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask Him that Jesus speaks of in Matthew 7.

What should we be asking of this loving God? Matthew 6:10-11, **“your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.”**

There seems to me a lofty thing in this and a basic request. The kingdom of God is the rule and reign of God in this world, our communities and in individual lives. So in praying for the kingdom of God to come you are praying for the saving grace of God that brings life, healing, justice, fairness, peace of mind (shalom which means wholeness), for many Christians it has become a life changing experience an eternal experience. If you ask what God’s will is, maybe in the past it was believed that was to make people toe the line.

People believe that that is the purpose of any religion. It takes away our freedoms. The true answer has to be though that His creation would flourish. Life is too valuable not to be lived and that is why he sent His Son into the world.

Jesus does not stop at the lofty prayer for His Kingdom to come. He turns our attention to the need for our basic needs to be met. Give us today our daily bread. It is incredible that even in our country people lack the basics of life. So, it is not just a problem in the developing world. We can ask God to help us with anything. Like any loving parent He would love to help and would love us to ask Him for help. Too many Christians think because of the abundance of needs in the world their needs are not important enough for God, but be assured that is not true.

I love a good mystery drama and I have come to the conclusion that most of the mysteries would not be as serious if only they shared the problem. And God is listening and waiting.

Then in prayer we can reflect on who we are and the possible flaws or foibles we have. **Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.** I love the idea that God is concerned enough about us that He wants to make us aware of our flaws or foibles not to shame us or do us down but enable us to live in relationship with Him and those around us. We can live in freedom rather than oppression. I have tried to make a garden at the manse, and it is good to see the shrubs and plants flourish when they are given the space and food to grow. So, it is for us as we are freed from our sins. I used to worry that God wanted to reveal my sins to those around me but rather than doing that He lets me know forgiveness and encourages me to forgive those who have sinned against me. Again, it is about life.

Then last but not least, all that leads to praise. Revelation 1:5-6, **“To Him who loves us and has freed from our sins by His blood and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to His God and Father, to Him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen.** It is more usual to start with praise recognising God for who He is. I want to encourage you to get involved in our programme of private prayer for the mission of our churches coming out of lockdown. Please do visit your church if you can for a few moments but pray at home as well.

But now we are going to sing our praise as a response for what God is going to do with us and for us.
